Cove Park's annual Open Studios event is an ideal opportunity to meet the artists on residency and see work in progress in the studio. This year's participating artists include ceramicist **Johannes Nagel** (Germany); visual artist **Gail Pickering** (London), visual artist, writer and film maker **Sarah Tripp** (Glasgow) and ceramicist **Dawn Youll** (Glasgow).

Cove Park is located on an outstanding 50-acre site overlooking Loch Long on Argyll's Rosneath peninsula. During the afternoon, visitors are welcome to explore the site and see Cove Park's unique studios and accommodation.

Katy McAulay lives in Glasgow and writes fiction in a variety of forms. A focus for her work is escape: the various ways in which people attempt it, what they're trying to flee from, and the question of whether escape is ever truly possible. While at Cove Park she has been working on the novel *'Please, Charleston Quietly'*, which she will be reading from at this event.

Ewan Morrison is the author of the novels *'Ménage'*, *'Distance'* and *'Swung'*, and the collection of short stories *'The Last Book You Read'*. He writes for a number of publications and has a weekly column in Scotland on Sunday. Ewan will both read from his work and discuss the art of Dorothy Shears, the video and installation artist.

Transport to Cove Park

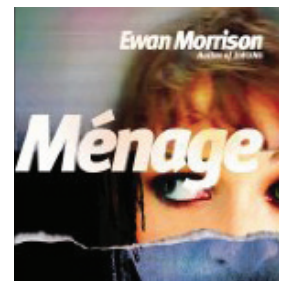
